## 2022-23 Reached or Exceeds Pell Lifetime Eligibility

**YOU HAVE REACHED YOUR LIFETIME PELL LIFETIME ELIGIBILITY USED LIMIT. YOU ARE NO LONGER ELIGIBLE FOR PELL GRANT FUNDING.**

**Pell Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU).** There is a limit to the total amount of Federal Pell Grants that a student may receive, which is equivalent of six school years (or 600%). Once you reach the 600%, you will be ineligible for any additional Pell Grants. The eligibility calculation includes all Pell grants you have received at any college or university in your lifetime.

**What this means for you:** This limit is a LIFETIME limit, regardless of completion of your academic goals. This regulation is in effect even if you have had an appeal approved after failure to meet academic progress, it supersedes any prior offer of aid, and the Department of Education allows for no appeal or exception to this limit.
